



If you are out and about in the quad at that time, please respect those who are observing the silence.




Please be considerate of our neighbours

Please remember that the college is situated amongst a residential area. Respect our neighbour's property and privacy. Any student intending to park in the vicinity of the college must ensure they park legally and with consideration to our neighbours and other road users. Do not park near driveways where residents need to enter and exit safely. Do not park so close to other vehicles that they cannot manoeuvre to drive away. The surrounding area is regularly patrolled by Police Community Officers who would also be notified of any problems and will take action if cars are parked illegally.

Be courteous and polite to everyone as you arrive and leave college. Do not loiter in the roads surrounding the college or block footpaths, which hinders the progress of others especially if they are with young children, have prams, are elderly or wheelchair users. Do not drop litter, including cigarettes, and remember that the park is also close to college and litter should be placed in the bins provided - you risk incurring a £75 fine from HDC if you are caught dropping litter. Also when food packaging and litter are dropped it encourages rats and other vermin and this should be avoided at all costs.

STUDENT PARKING



Please park responsibly in areas surrounding the college. The hospital is not an appropriate place to park, not least because it takes space away from patients of the hospital who need easy access, and not paying to park there will result in a parking fine. The hospital vicinity is also not a suitable area for congregating in groups. If students are parking in residential areas, they need to drive in a respectful way, park responsibly and be mindful of local residents. We have recently had reports of music blaring and poor language of students parked in

local roads. Our main advice is for students to be greener by walking, cycling, and using public transport. Thank you!
