

# 2025 Award Schemes

# Helena Kennedy Foundation

Higher Education Award



- The HKF HE Award offers support to final year students who are aiming to start a first-time programme of higher education in the autumn at a UK higher education institution and can demonstrate;
- they face severe financial hardship which will make their progression to higher education difficult
- they have overcome significant barriers to complete their further education

Each year the Foundation receives applications from many more students than they are able to support. You should only apply if you are facing severe financial hardship which will make your progression to higher education difficult.

#### Successful applicants of the award are offered:

- Financial support, usually in the form of a £2,250 bursary provided in instalments during your time in higher education.
- Personal support by having ongoing contact with the Foundation and the opportunity to take part in the Foundation's training, mentoring and work-shadowing programmes.

# Hurst Road crossing points
